

## Year End Information for Parents

As this school year winds down, we have been preparing for the 2009-10 school year.

If your student has outstanding fees due, please make plans to pay these before taking off for the summer. Keeping these accounts current will speed up your enrollment process in the Fall. If you are unsure if your student's fees are current, please call the office at 554-2281.

Letters have been sent to the parents of those students needing updated immunizations for the 2009-2010 school year. Those immunizations must be completed and documentation turned in to the Rex Health Room by the first day of school, August 18, 2009, or your child WILL NOT be allowed to attend school until they are done.

Information for Free/Reduce lunches will be included in the Mail-In Enrollment Package to be sent out during the first week of July.

### ENROLLMENT 2009-10

All current USD 261 students will use mail-in enrollment for the 2009-10 school year. Kindergarten and ECC students who attend Kindergarten Round-Up in April will also enroll by mail.

Mail-in enrollment packets will be mailed in early July and should be mailed back to the district office by July 24. Enrollment packets will include all forms, fee information, and supply lists for the coming school year. **All forms must be filled out and returned** in order to complete the enrollment process. Any outstanding fees should be paid prior to enrollment.

The district will conduct a one-day enrollment for students who are new to the Haysville school district. The 2009 New Student En-

rollment will be held on August 6 at the Haysville Middle School, 900 West Grand, from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Documents needed for enrollment include a copy of the student's state certified birth certificate, immunization records and proof of residence in the Haysville School District. Acceptable proof of residence includes a current utility bill (gas, water, or electric only) showing the parent or guardian's name and a current rental or purchase agreement. Questions about residency should be directed to Debbie Coleman, 554-2200. Enrollment fees are due at the time of enrollment. They may be paid by cash, check or credit card (MasterCard or Visa).

**Only students who are new to the district and are not attending a Haysville USD**

**261 school and kindergarten students who did not attend the Kindergarten Round-Up will enroll in person. All others will be enrolled by mail.**

The Sedgwick County Health Department Mobile Unit will be on site at the New Student Enrollment to offer immunizations from 1:30-6 pm. Both new students who are participating in the enrollment and current Haysville students who need to update their immunizations can use this service. Questions about immunizations should be referred to the District Nurse, 554-2200.

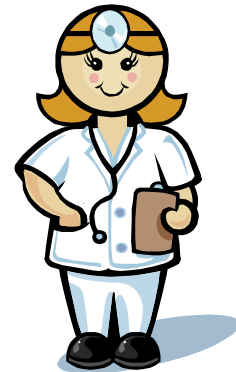
All children under the age of 5 should have received letters re: needing 2 Hep A injections. The injections are given 6 months apart and so they need to get their first one immediately. This is a new requirement this year.

No longer will the parent's signature be accepted for the chickenpox disease. It will need to be a signed note from the Doctor stating that your child indeed did have the chickenpox.

If your child takes/has medication at school, you will be receiving a letter that they need to be picked up or sent with your child by the 20th & 21st of May. I prefer you pick them up, but if you are unable to do so, please give me a call and I will send them home with your child.
