3.0 USD 261 ITEMS

- **Community Growth**
USD 261 continues to grow in population.
Ms. Walston asked if the City has done a recent population study.
Mayor Armstrong said the City has not done a recent study.
- **Bond Projects**
Dr. Clint Schutte gave a brief update on the District's most current construction projects. Dr. Schutte noted that the District would be closing the track by Haysville West Middle School to the public due to construction activities, but the District will be opening the track at Colt Stadium for public use.
- **Gannon Court Decision**
Ms. Walston, Dr. Burke and Dr. Schutte gave an overview of the status of the Gannon Court decision and what a possible July 1, 2016 school closing could mean for USD 261 and the Haysville community.

4.0 CITY OF HAYSVILLE ITEMS

Mayor Bruce Armstrong, Will Black, Randy Dorner and Georgie Carter provided information on City improvements including the progress on the construction of the new recreation facility, area parks, bike paths/sidewalks, new soccer fields and pedestrian foot bridges.

Ms. Carter also noted that the Aviators baseball season has started, the Home Town Market is up and going, 4th of July activities are scheduled, and this Saturday, June 11th will be the second and final week of the trash pickup for Haysville.

Mayor Armstrong stated that the new entry signs for Haysville will be installed within the next two weeks.
