1.0 MEETING OPENING

1.1 Call to Order

Glenn Crum opened the meeting at 6:00 p.m. with five Board members present and one member (Greg Fenster) participating by phone.

2.0 BOARD INTERVIEW

Dr. Susan Norton was the only candidate for the open position on the USD 261 Board of Education created by the resignation of Forrest Hummel. A second candidate withdrew their application.

Due to Dr. Norton being out-of-town for a prior commitment, her interview was recorded on a previous date and viewed via computer projection by the Board.

The candidate was allowed 3-minutes to address the Board. After the 3-minute presentation the candidate was asked questions concerning their qualification for Board membership. The candidate was given 1-minute for each response.

At the conclusion of the interview presentation Mr. Crum asked for a motion and second.

MOTION to appoint Dr. Susan Norton to fill the unexpired term of former Board member Forrest Hummel. (P. Crum / Walston) Motion carried 5-1. Greg Fenster voted no via phone conference call.
