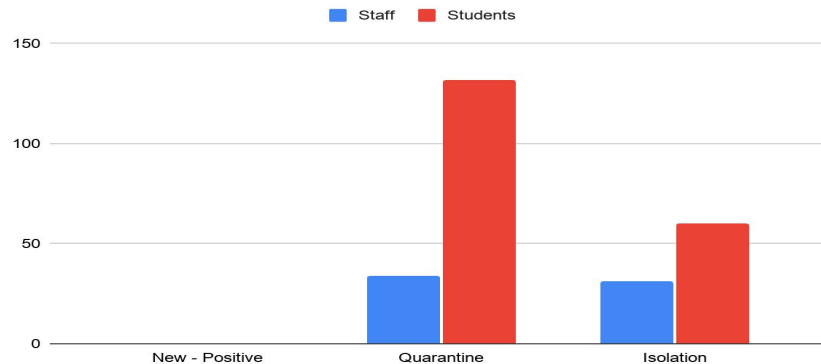
Elementary Parent Choice Remote or On-Site with Social Distancing or Cohort Grouping

Suspend onsite use of Therapy Animals

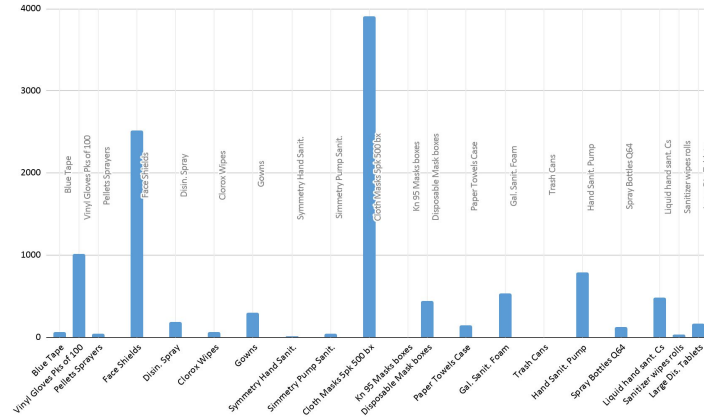
Student & Staff - Quarantine/Isolations

- Principals and teachers manage the student activities and are notified when someone is put in quarantine or isolation
- Building administrators and department directors manage the staffing coverage

Employee Benefit Extension

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) “CARES” leave expires on December 31, 2020.

The administration feels it is important to allow all staff the same opportunity for the up to 2 weeks of leave for equality and support.

Haysville USD 261 will extend the same leave for our employees through May 31, 2021. If legislation is extended or new legislation is passed during the period we will defer to Federal regulations.

Secondary Schools - 6-12 Grades

- Remote Learning for students with on-site exceptions based on individual educational needs
 - Students with IEPS
 - Secondary Classes that do not function in a remote environment
- Timing for changes in format
 - Possible Continuation of Remote through the 3rd Nine Week Grading period
 - Return to On-site learning
- Extra Curricular Activities are allowed following SCHED, KDHE, and KSHSAA Guidelines
 - No Spectators

KSHSAA - Guideline Update

KSHSAA updated their guidelines to allow up to 2 spectators per participant for extra-curricular activities.

The variation in capacity of Haysville USD 261 facilities will not allow 2 spectators per participant.

- We are asking for a resolution to allow spectators at Haysville USD 261 Extracurricular Activities based on facility capacity not to exceed KSHSAA Guidelines.

Elementary Schools Pre-K thru 5th Grade

Parent choice for remote /onsite learning options.

Onsite learning with masks, social distancing or cohort grouping.

Principals coordinate the transition for families that would like a change in learning mode.

KDHE, SCDH, KSDE indication that elementary students are less likely to carry, transmit, or have severe reactions to COVID - 19.

Haysville USD 261 has multiple options(A-F) for Remote Elementary Learning

Current Recommendation is to continue Parent Choice for Elementary Schools
