Safety is the number one priority

Following KDHE, SCDH, and KSDE Guidelines and Safety Protocols

Safety focus:

- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth to help protect yourself and others.
- Stay 6 feet apart from others. Use of Cohort Grouping as needed
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water aren't available.

# Quarantine FAQ:

- Who is required to quarantine?
  - Any person that is considered a close contact
- What is a close contact?
  - A close contact is any person that was within 6 feet of the person who tested positive for COVID-19 for 10 minutes
- How long is quarantine?
  - Quarantine is 10 days, beginning the day after contact with the person who tested positive for COVID-19
- Is there any way to shorten quarantine?
  - Yes. If the person in quarantine does not develop any symptoms, he or she is eligible to have a PCR test completed on day 6 of quarantine. If this test is negative, he or she may return on day 8.
- Can a rapid COVID-19 test or antibody testing be used to shorten quarantine?
  - No. Only PCR testing will allow a shortened quarantine period.
- Is there any time that a person would not need to quarantine?
  - Yes. A person who is not having symptoms would not have to quarantine with the following documentation:
    - § Documentation of a positive COVID-19 test within the last 90 days
    - § Documentation from a medical provider at the time of illness that the person is presumptively positive for COVID-19. This illness must have occurred within the last 90 days.

# Secondary Schools - 6-12 Grades

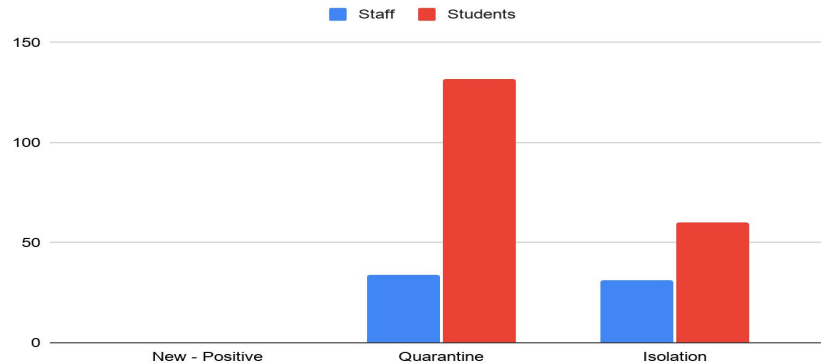
- Parent choice for remote /onsite learning options. Current Parent Choice will be in place through the 3rd nine week period
- Extra Curricular Activities are allowed following SCHED, KDHE, and KSHSAA Guidelines
  - Spectators allowed based on site capacity

# COVID Testing

- We implemented both the rapid and saliva PCR tests. The rapids are from KDHE and we are a partner with WSU for the PCR tests.
- Daily numbers vary
- We offer testing at the schools and drive-thru at our Admin building
- Our health staff members have been calling to check on students and staff who are called in sick all year, but now, if the symptoms fit, they can offer drive-thru testing
- Students and staff who are at school are tested in the isolation room in the building.

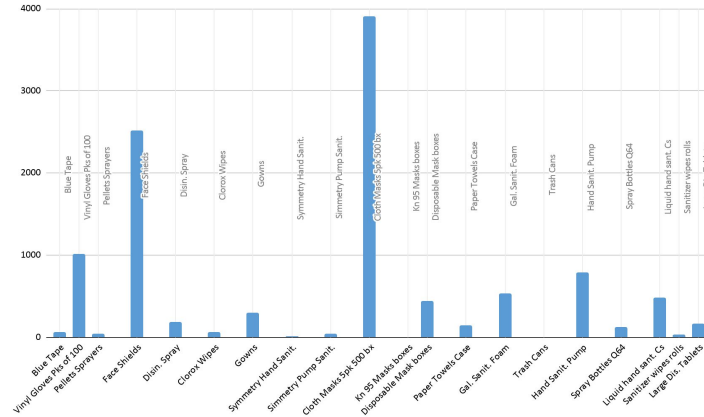
# Student & Staff - Quarantine/Isolations

- Nursing staff collect and report the numbers on a daily basis
- Principals and teachers manage the student activities and are notified when someone is put in quarantine or isolation
- Building administrators and department directors manage the staffing coverage

- These supplies are tracked for quantity and availability
- Additional purchases are made as supplies indicate and we try to anticipate the shortage thru continuous communication with our vendors
