Literacy First at Oatville

What do retelling, summarizing, main idea, predicting, clarifying and questioning all have in common? These are essential comprehension skills that every child needs in order to understand the text that they read.

Teachers use a variety of tools to help your child comprehend while reading. Graphic organizers, modeling 'think-alouds' or making "I Wonder..." statements, activating prior knowledge to help your child to make connections to the text, and asking higher-level thinking questions are just a few.

Some ways you can help your child comprehend the stories or passages they are reading are to start with that emotional hook. Ask your child why they chose the library book they brought home. What do they know about the topic? Discuss the meaning of vocabulary used in the story. Model a 'think-aloud' such as "I'm wondering why there is an empty lake on the front cover..." Have them predict what will happen before they start the next chapter. Showing an interest and engaging in your child's reading will help cement those comprehension skills and instill a love for literacy.
