NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION.....COOPERATION



- 5 – 3 – 1 Go --Switching tasks is difficult for children. Give them a 5 minute heads up that you will be changing tasks (leaving a park, turning off the TV, going to bed, taking a bath).
- Grandma's Rule--As soon as you _____, you can _____.
- Give clear instructions--Say exactly what you mean (Make your bed. Put your clothes in the laundry. Have the child repeat it back to you. Say thank you.
- Give a choice--Make sure both are acceptable to you. Don't give them a choice you do not want them to choose.
- Make it brief--Use a single word versus a lecture. The longer you talk, the less they hear.
- Write it down--Use a note, chart or pictures if they are too young to read. (Stay in bed cards. Child gets 3 cards each night. She/he can use the first two for anything. But if they use the 3rd card, they don't get cards the next night.)
- Use rules and routines...morning routines and evening routines can help the time be less stressful. If you establish the routine of homework after dinner, you might say, "Table is clean" and the child will learn that means it is time for homework.
